The class was taught by John Shimkus, who worked with a student teacher that year to design a whole new curriculum focused on ancient times.

"It was an amazing class," Dr. Bull said. "More than anything else, I felt like I was part of piloting some new experiment with the class. Mr. Shimkus helped cultivate in me an intellectual curiosity that continues to this day."

Dr. Bull, who graduated from MELHS in 1989, has gone on to make his own mark in educational innovation, serving as president of Goddard College in Vermont before being installed as the 11th president of Concordia University, Nebraska in August.
