#### Harry Potter and the Interim of Imagination Presented by Mr. Giordano

We will explore themes like love, loyalty, loss, faith, suffering, mortality, and life after death through the lens of JK Rowling's iconic series. Both the books and movies will serve as source material as we trace the theological threads present in them, connecting to our everyday lives as we also learn the "stories behind the stories". (No Cost)

#### All About Dogs Presented by Mrs. Covarrubias

Are you a dog-lover? Are you interested in a career with animals? Join Mrs. Covarrubias on a week filled with guest speakers (and barkers!) to show-and-tell us about all aspects of our canine best friends! Guest speakers may include animal trainers, veterinarians, animal behaviorists, animal nutritionists, dog groomers, and animal shelter/rescue workers. Canine visitors will hopefully include working dogs such as police and/or military dogs, LCMS comfort dogs, and guide/health support dogs. We will watch at least one film together, and to round out the week, we are also hoping to visit Purina Farms in St. Louis to tour their facilities and see a dog agility show! Cost is estimated between \$10-\$25. Meals are not included. Schedule may vary from day to day.

It is time to explore the magic of Disney. Students will be participating in three classes exploring different parts of how the magic is made. The classes include Theme Park Design, Technology of Disney Parks, and Immersive Storytelling. In all of these classes students will get a behind the scenes look on different aspects of the Disney parks. After the classes are over students will have a chance to explore the parks and all the magic they bring (Cost \$1,400)

#### Castles, Cathedrals, Coastlines and Countrysides by Ms. Thompson

The British Isles have inspired imaginations for centuries. From the rolling, rugged beauty of the Ring of Kerry to magnificent man-made cathedrals like St. Patrick's in Dublin and Shakespeare's birthplace in Stratford, you'll feel the spirits of history by your side every step of the way. #### The Great Outdoors Presented by Mr. Lorenz

Join Mr. Lorenz for a week-long expedition of hiking excursions. We will take in some beautiful and unique hikes. Beyond regular hiking, we can discuss the possibility of a "hike through the trees" at a zip-line course, a "hike up a wall" at a rock climbing course, a "hike on wheels" if we go for a bike ride, or even a "hike like a ninja" if we decide to train at an American Ninja Warrior Course. Expect some surprises along the way!!!! There will be some cost - the cost will depend on what adventures we decide on as a group, and you may need your own bike. (Cost \$30-\$80)

#### **Dessert Decorating by Mrs. Wudtke and Avah Jones**

Avah Jones will teach us the basics of decorating with buttercream, and royal icing. Basic piping tools will be supplied. We will also be baking different types of treats. Such as breads, cookies, etc. (Cost \$50)

#### What Does It Mean to Be Lutheran by Mrs. Shimkus

What does it mean to be a Lutheran in America? What is the LCMS? How did Lutherans even get established here (most Lutherans have roots in Germany and Scandinavia). This interim will explore the history of Lutheranism in America. We will research genealogy of 'good Lutheran names' such as Lorenz, Shilbe, Fedder, etc. at a Lutheran heritage site. Other historic Lutheran sites will be visited (Perry County, St. Louis Seminary and vicinity) and field trips to the Concordia Historical Society and the LCMS International Center will be undertaken. You attend a Lutheran High School. Celebrate (and be knowledgeable about) being what it took for Lutherans to be established in America. This is not just about the God-given theology which you get in class every day, but more about the rich history of the LCMS and the people who had the conviction to preserve and promote those truths in the 1800's.

#### Movies with Meador by Mr. Meador

Is your head filled with endless Movie quotes? Do you enjoy seeing a plot develop, or a character ark? In this interim, we will spend time watching, discussing, and reviewing several movies that were pivotal in the landscape of cinema. We will take a field trip to a local cinema, to get a behind the scenes tour. We will also take a look at how the pros get it done, and all that goes into a movie. Once we have spent time doing this, students will have the chance to choose or develop a script, learn how to film like pros, edit, and premiere the movie on the last day of class. (Cost \$50)

#### **Esports by Mr. Moldenhauer**

Enjoy playing soccer with cars? Want to take your game to the next level? Then this is the interim for you! This is a class all about Rocket League. Mr. Moldenhauer will be partnering up with the esports team at SIUE to teach you more about your favorite flying cars and how to get those saves that people are always going on and on...and on about. We will cover general skills that will help with any esport, like teamwork, communication, and patience, as well as mechanics geared specifically toward Rocket League. If you want to join this interim but don't know how to play Rocket League, we recommend that you learn the basics of how to play by the time interim starts. This class will have a small cost. We hope to use the esports arena at SIUE, so we will split that cost among the participants. (Cost \$15)
